

What is the current status of the project? The City is conducting an EIS.

How do we know there are other ways? CENSE has many engineers who have reviewed the data. And CENSE is working with two experts who have reviewed the data. One of the experts is the former VP of Power Planning for Puget Power and Light (predecessor company of PSE)

Current Details.

Bellevue is the lead agency on the EIS for the PSE project. In June, the comment period for the EIS on the PSE project was concluded. On July 30, 2015 the City issued a Scoping Summary Report in which it summarized the comments made by citizens during the comment

Energy) opposes the City's decision to eliminate alternatives without any analysis. CENSE has raised money and hired a land use lawyer to oppose the City's decision to eliminate alternatives.

CENSE submitted its Letter of Objections to the City's decision. We expect a response from the City by the end of September.

New Park on 140th – Loretta Lopez

As you have read in this newsletter, the BTCC worked with City and the Parks Board to purchase property on 140th to build a park. There is not enough money to build a park but we are hopeful that over the years there will be funds to complete the 140th park.

The next step in this process is to develop a Master Park Plan.

The City will hold the 2nd public meeting on the planning for the 140th park on Wednesday, October 7, at 7:00 at the North Bellevue Community Center. The City will send a postcard notice to all residents in the Bridle Trails area. The City will present a project overview, share comments from the survey, present design concepts and explain the next steps. NEP is Back! \$370K for BT! – Pamela Johnston

What would you do with \$370, 000? Bridle Trails will receive \$370,000 in 2018 for public capital improvements in the Neighborhood Enhancement Program (NEP). Now that the City budget made it through the recession, City Council renewed NEP, with some changes. NEP funds are proportioned by the number of households. Fund availability will rotate through the Bellevue neighborhood areas, two a year. Bridle Trails residents will propose and vote on the projects that meet the NEP goals. Look for information in the coming year from Neighborhood Outreach on the details.

What changes would make our neighborhood more enjoyable, healthier, or safer? Although the NEP funds do not become available until 2018, the planning starts now.
