PSE Project

Energize Eastside Draft Environmental Impact Study Phase 1 is expected to be issued on January 22,2016. This will begin a 45 day public comment period. The Coalition of Eastside Neighborhoods for Sensible Energy (CENSE) will be providing expert comments on other applicable options besides a 230,000 Volt Transmission Line with up to 125foot towers. Your comments are also invited.

Several items for comment among others are: Electrical Loads Analysis: CENSE has engaged experts to complete an electrical loads analysis to determine the need for a new transmission line. It is expected that it will show that it will be many years before a new transmission line capacity is needed. Stay tuned to CENSE.org

Olympic Pipeline Safety Issues:

A recent letter to the Bellevue City Council stated that the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) requires a 50 foot safety clearance between Transmission Lines and Pipelines such as British Petroleum's Olympic high pressure fuel lines. This could affect the route of the proposed PSE Transmission line.

Swift Stormwater Initiative affects Trees, Roadways, and **Density** – Pamela Johnston

By Dec 2016, the City of Bellevue is mandated to incorporate Low Impact Design (LID) into their codes and standards by the state and the Clean Water Act. LID best management practices are ways for the stormwater to drain and filter and not affect other properties or water.

LID may change the urban forest. LID may permit designs that allow houses in a development to be closer than normal if there is other open space (clustering). LID may change street and building site designs and make new materials more popular.
