# Let's Talk Traffic

Congestion getting you down? Do you

feel safe on the street? Karen Gonzales, Neighborhood Traffic Services Manager, and Rick Logwood, Project Manager Supervisor, from the City of Bellevue's Transportation Department will speak about traffic calming and safety in the Bridle Trails Community and traffic impacts of the BelRed area.

Besides public and private trails, our streets are our means of travel and our location for utilities. Tree lined streets help define the Bridle Trails Neighborhood character. People and dogs enjoy a walk or hurry off to school. Horses and riders enjoy make their way to the Bridle Trails State Park. Bicycles take on our hilly terrain; cars are ubiquitous. Our unique area does not allow for cookie-cutter solutions to traffic congestion and safety.

Curb, gutter, and sidewalk are expensive and are out of character with much of the streets in our neighborhood. Not everyone has a horse, but solutions that are safe for horses are safe for pedestrians.

Some key items were

- Skylights will have blinds that automatically close at dusk
- Parking areas light levels reduced to minimal at night (11:00 pm to 6:30 am)
- Rooftop mechanical equipment will be shielded from both side and top views. A screening element will be added to rooftop area along with rooftop planters with trees to break up the view of this area.
- BMW volunteered to restrict test drives to commercial areas. Sales customers shall always be accompanied by an employee to assure that test drives follow an approved route.
- Water Quality must meet City Standards, plus BMW is required to apply for Developer Extension Agreement.

# Bridle Trails Park #2 Loretta Lopez

After three public comments meeting and recommendations from BT residents, the City completed the Master Plan for Bridle Trails Parks #2. The Park is located on 140<sup>th</sup>.

The Bridle Trails Community Club approved the Plan at the March BTCC general meeting. On May 10, 2016, the Parks Department presented the Final Master Plan for Bridle Trails Park #2 to the City Parks Board.

Loretta Lopez attended the Parks Board meeting to thank the Parks Department Staff for its support and work and to and to answer questions. The Parks Board approved the Master Plan. The Parks Department will present the Master Plan to the City Council on June 27. Although there is no funding for the park at this time, we hope that there will be funds to build the park in the future.

# Built in Cheaper Stormwater Codes Pamela Johnston

Thinking of building a patio or cutting down some trees? You are influencing stormwater. The City is proposing changes in the building codes to incorporate Low Impact Development (LID). LID is focused stormwater management, leading to less and cleaner stormwater runoff and avoiding conventional constructions such as retention tanks. Besides being State requirement and helping to protect the water quality, LID will save the City money overtime.

Proposed code changes include these and more:

- Reduces the land can be covered by buildings or non-permeable hard surfaces for new projects.
- Adds that reductions back in for permeable surfaces, making the land coverage unchanged.
- Allows for zero side setbacks in some cases
- Requires a permit for removing more than 5 trees\*
- Changes the definition of significant tree.\*
- Removes the difference between healthy and unhealthy tree.\*
   \* Effects BT non-R1. Different code covers BT properties zoned R-1

Changes are proposed to the City's building Guidelines and Standards. The project must be complete by December 31, 2016. Attend the Public Hearings for the Transportation Commission on June 9 and Planning

Commission on June 22.

While LID will not reduce an individual's storm water charges, saving money for the whole system will save money on the stormwater system, with less stormwater to process and clean.
